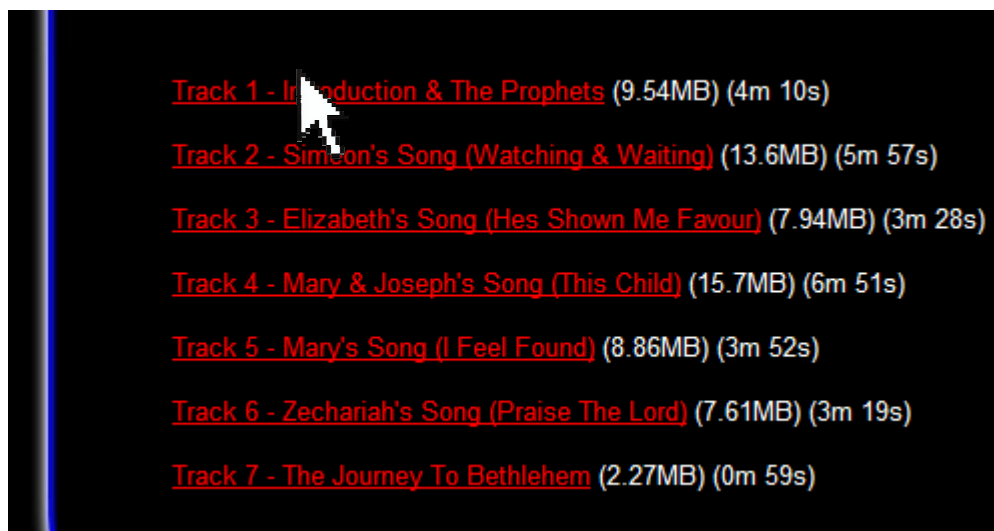
Instructions For Downloading An MP3 File From BibleStoryZone To Your Computer

As an example, I will use a track from the Immanuel 1 CD. The same principles apply to any MP3 file download on the BibleStoryZone website.

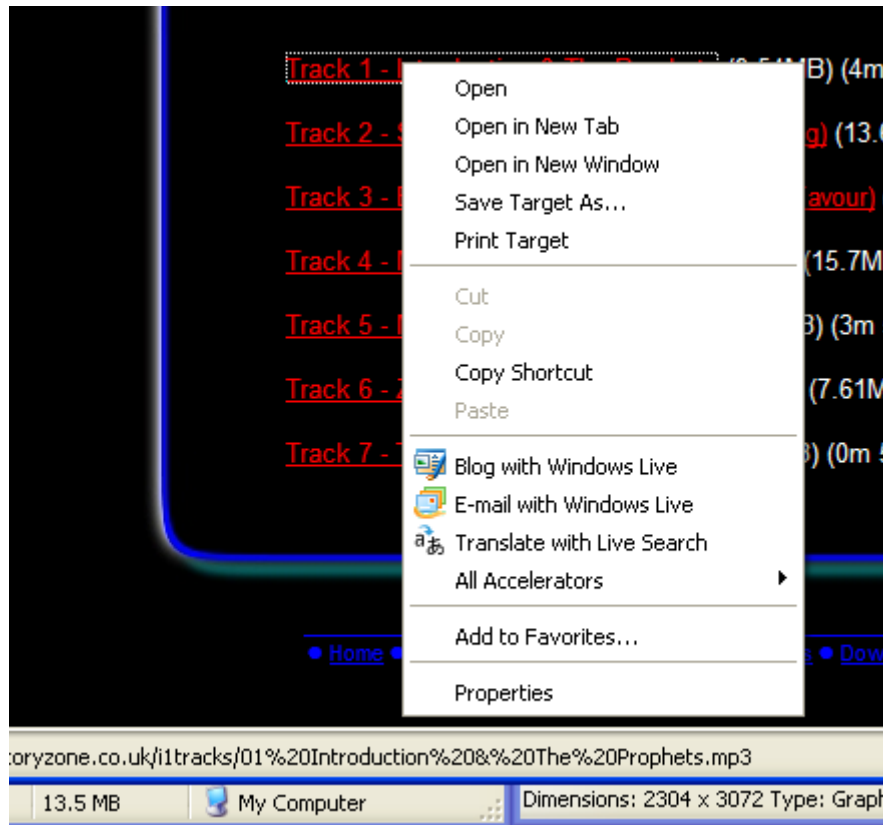
1. Navigate to the webpage where the MP3 you wish to download is listed.



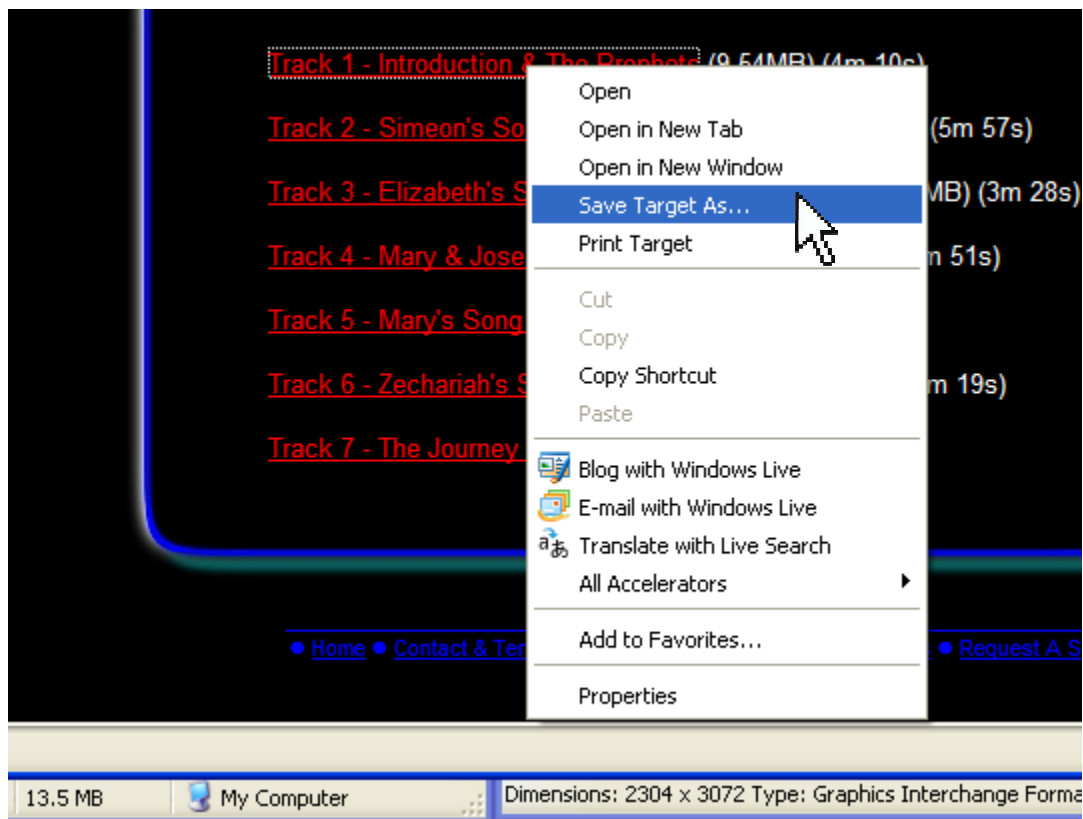
2. Place the cursor over the filename...



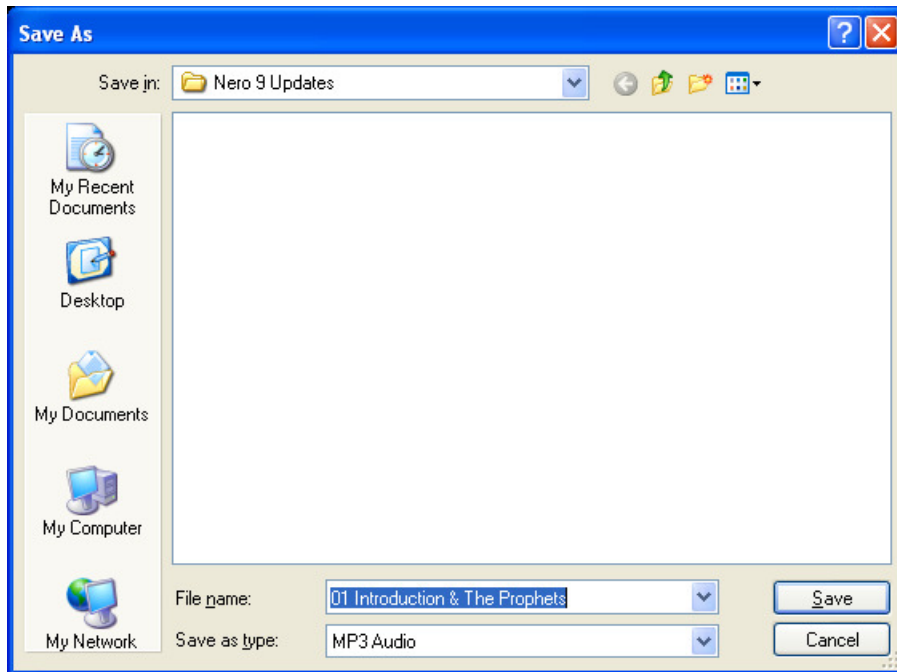
3. ...and single right-click on your mouse to open the drop-down menu.



4. Move the cursor down to 'Save Target As...'

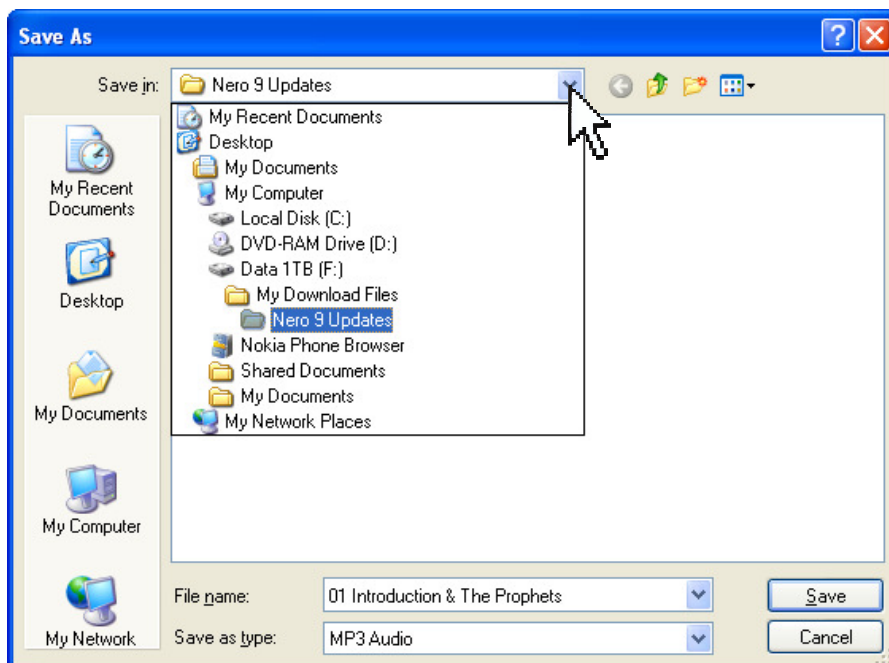


5. ...and single left-click on your mouse. The 'Save As' dialogue box will appear on your screen.



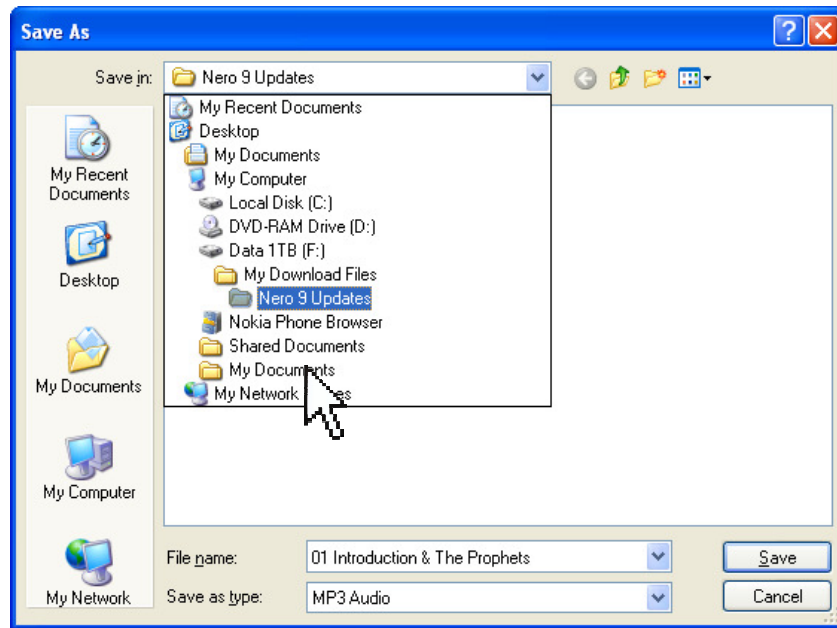
This box allows you to choose where on your computer to save the file you are going to download.

6. Single left-click on the blue down arrow next to the 'Save In' drop-down selection bar...

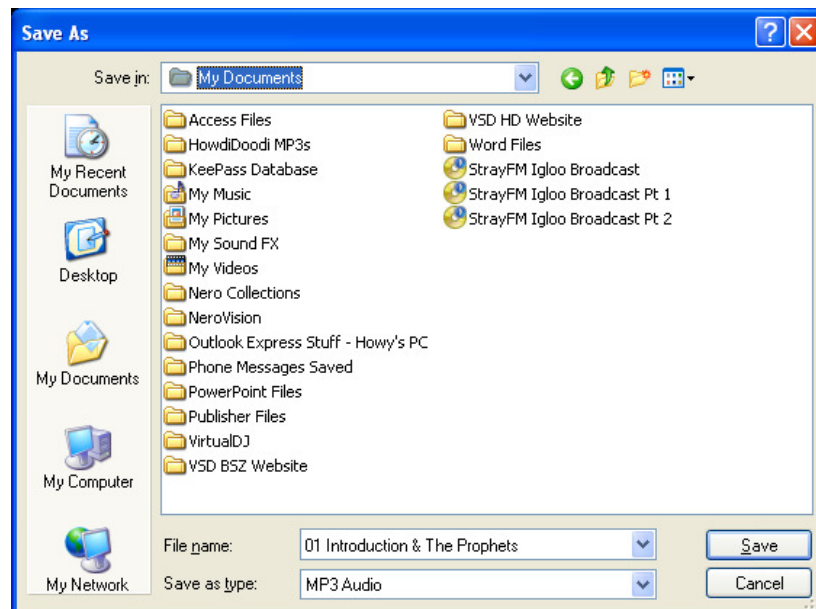


...and you will see all the locations available to save on your computer.

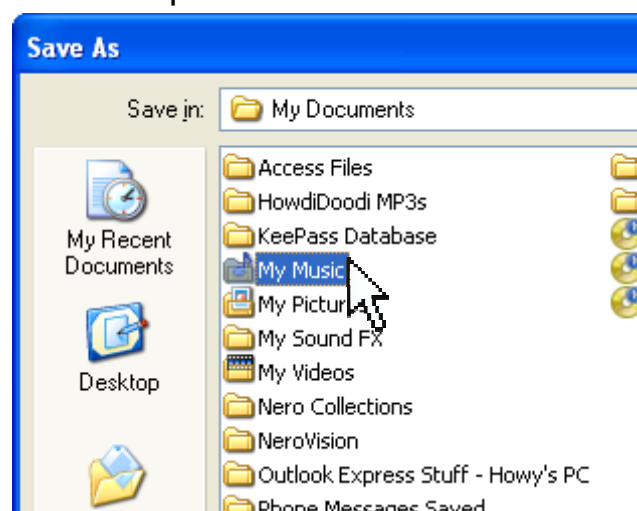
7. Move the cursor over 'My Documents' and single left-click.

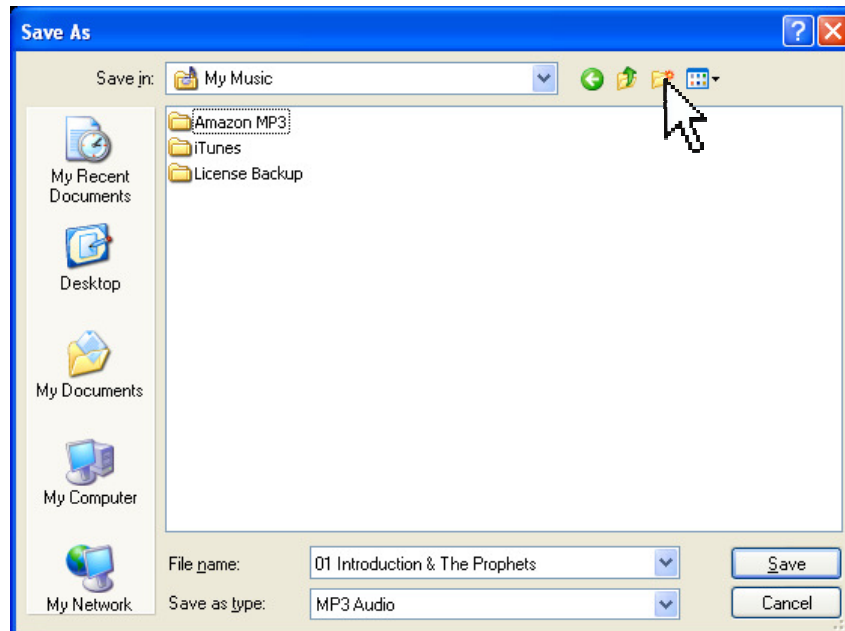


8. The contents of 'My Documents' on your computer will be displayed

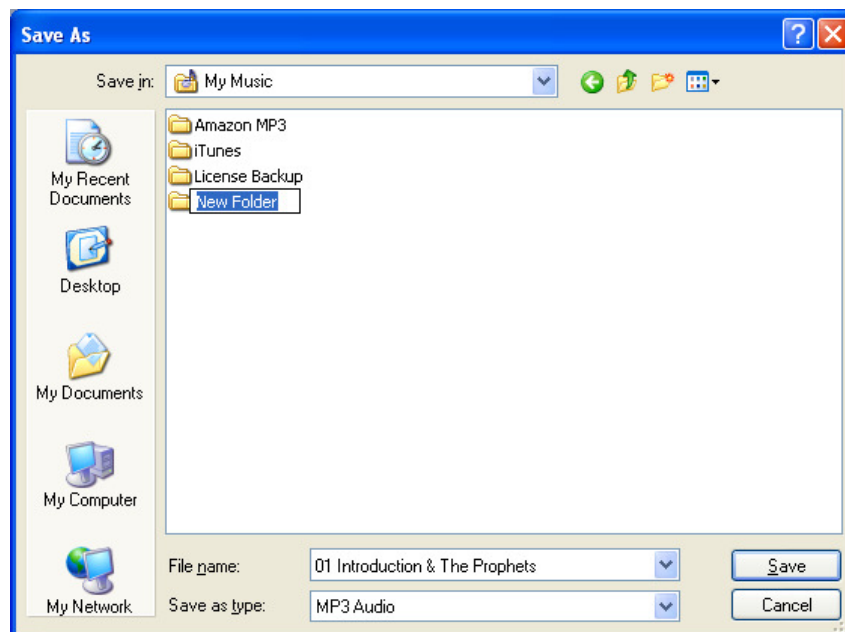


9. Move the cursor over 'My Music' (as this is where most people store their music files) and **double** left-click it to open the folder.

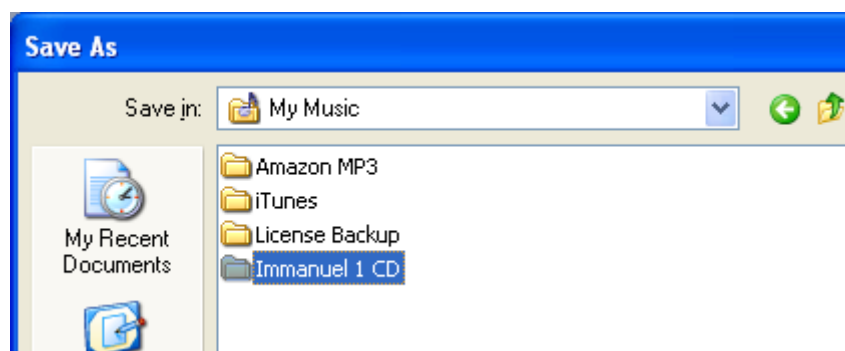




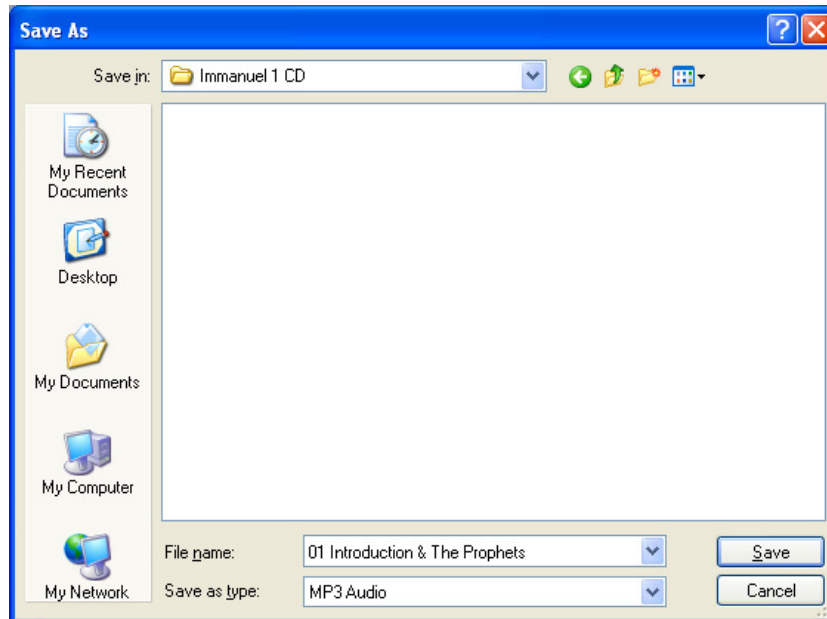
10. If this is the first time you have saved an MP3 from this album or set, you will need to create a new folder to store your file in, otherwise skip to step 11. To do this, single left-click over the 'New Folder' icon (folder with orange star on the top task bar) which will create a new folder ready for you to name.



In this case I would call the folder 'Immanuel 1 CD'. You can call it whatever you like as long as in the future you recognise what it contains. Type it into the flashing blue box and then press the Enter key.

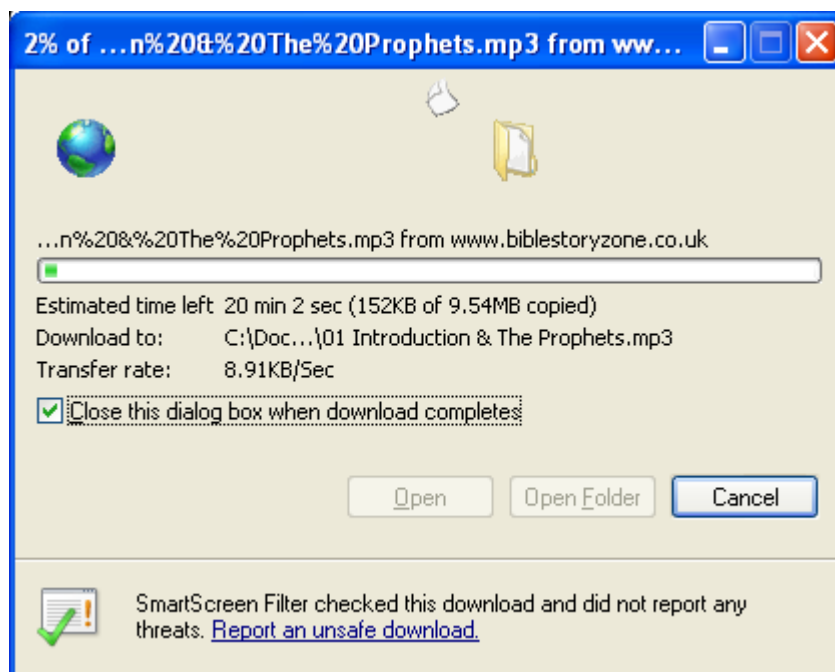


11. Move the cursor over 'Immanuel 1 CD' (or whatever you called the new folder) and **double** left-click it to open the folder.



12. If you look in the 'File name' dialogue box, the name of the file is already defined. I suggest you keep the default name in order to keep the tracks in the correct order when you download and save more. The default setting for file type is MP3. Leave that as it is also.

Now single left click on the 'Save' button to start the download...



The file will now download and save. If you have checked the box marked 'Close this dialogue box...', this window will close automatically when the download has completed.

Repeat from the start for any further tracks you wish to download & save.
